Plasterboard Recycling Facilities

Knauf encourages the recycling of plasterboard waste. Plasterboard is 100% recyclable and at end of life can be fully diverted from landfill. If disassembled and free from contaminants such as fasteners, nails, screws and wall coverings, the gypsum component of plasterboard waste can be recycled back into production processes. It can also be recycled for agricultural use and the paper liner can be recycled into bulk paper products.

There are several waste collection services and recycling facilities throughout Australia capable of recycling plasterboard from construction sites. These waste recycling facilities or services specify the criteria for pick up or receipt of plasterboard waste.
